The Khmer Rouge Tribunal (ECCC) in Phnom Penh is preparing for the second trial (Case 002) against four top surviving leaders of the Khmer Rouge: Nuon Chea, Ieng Sary, Ieng Thirith, and Khieu Samphan.

Come learn about the upcoming trial and meet the attorneys representing the ASRIC survivors before the ECCC in Case 002. There will be presentations on the Tribunal as well as a discussion about reparations aimed at understanding what the Cambodian community in the United States hopes to learn and gain from the trial. **We welcome community members to bring any mementos or photos to illustrate your story of survival during and after the Khmer Rouge.** This is an opportunity for the Cambodian community to share their stories of survival with one another as well as voice any questions or concerns about the upcoming trial with attorneys working before the Tribunal.
